a fascinating story of the caribbean island of redonda the reader is left to determine what is myth legend fiction or fact at times the story is highly amusing as king leo draws his own conclusions about his kingdom

previous principles of hierarchy inequality and duty that defined the relationships between husband wife and children have been challenged and often replaced by more fluid bonds of equality intimacy emotional self disclosure communication and mutual trust the key question that has emerged for our times then is how exactly do families sustain genuine mutuality democracy and strong relationships figuring out good answers to this question is the major theme of this book and the origin of the title mutuality matters

are intimate relations between clergy and those they serve or between mental health professionals and their patients ethical do such relations represent an abuse of power this book squarely addresses these questions and contains surprising answers while uniformly supporting victims and abhoring abuse these contributors reveal profound differences in interpreting the need for boundries in healing relationships

what do you do when you run into a patient in a public place how do you respond when a patient suddenly hugs you at the end of a

session do you accept a gift that a patient brings to make up for causing you some inconvenience questions like these which virtually all clinicians face at one time or another have serious clinical ethical and legal implications this authoritative practical book uses compelling case vignettes to show how a wide range of boundary questions arise and can be responsibly resolved as part of the process of therapy coverage includes role reversal gifts self disclosure out of office encounters physical contact and sexual misconduct strategies for preventing boundary violations and managing associated legal risks are highlighted

inspired by the clinical and ethical contributions of muriel dimen social aspects of sexual boundary trouble goes beyond the established consensus that sexual boundary violations sbv constitute a serious breach of professional ethics in order to explore the cultural and historical implications of their chronic persistence in rotten apples and ambivalence her last major publication dimen 2016 maintained that the phenomenon of sexual transgression between analyst and patient is insufficiently addressed so long as it is only deemed psychological in responding to and developing dimen s argument the distinguished contributors to this volume bring the discussion of sbv to a new level of ethical rigor and depth challenging the psychoanalytic profession to go beyond its codified complacency this collection shatters normative professional guidelines by focusing on the complicity and hypocrisy of professional groups while at the same time raising the taboo subject of the ordinary practicing clinician s unconscious professional ambivalence and potentially rogue sexual subjectivity social aspects of sexual boundary trouble uncovers the roots of sbv in the institutional origins and history of psychoanalysis as a profession exploring dimen s concept of the psychoanalytic primal crime which is in some ways constitutive of the profession and the inherently unstable nature of interpersonal and professional boundaries social aspects of sexual boundary trouble breaks new ground in the continuing struggle of psychoanalysis to reconcile itself with its liminal social status and its origins as a subversive morally ambiguous practice it will be highly relevant to specialists in psychoanalysis psychotherapy critical theory feminist studies and social thought

heightened awareness of the problem of sexual abuse has led to deep anxiety over adults touching children in nearly any context though our society has moved toward increasingly strict enforcement of this taboo studies have shown that young children need regular human contact and the benefits of breastfeeding have been widely extolled exploring the complicated history of love desire gender sexuality parenthood and inequality erotic attunement probes the disquieting issue of how we can draw a clear line between natural affection toward children and perverse exploitation of them cristina I h traina demonstrates that we cannot determine what is wrong about sexual abuse without first understanding what is good about appropriate sensual affection pondering topics such as the importance of touch in nurturing children the psychology of abuse and victimhood and recent ideologies of motherhood she argues that we must expand our philosophical and theological language of physical love and make a distinction between sexual love and erotic love taking on theological and ethical arguments over the question of sexuality between unequals she arrives at the provocative conclusion that it can

be destructive to completely bar eroticism from these relationships

a scholarly volume that reflects the rich diversity of anglican theology with contributions from an international panel of writers twentieth century anglican theologians offers a wide ranging view that presents a survey of over twenty diverse anglican thinkers the book explores well known figures including william temple austin farrer donald mackinnon and john a trobinson these theologians are set in a wider context alongside others from india china australia ghana and elsewhere notably the subjects include a number of women from evelyn underhill the first woman to teach the clergy of the church of england to esther mombo a major contemporary anglican figure from kenya the book reflects the rich diversity of anglicanism suggesting the ongoing vitality of this religious tradition this important book contains information on a number of prominent women anglican thinkers includes contributions from experts from around the world presents material on both familiar figures and others that are unjustly little known written for students and teachers of anglicanism anglican clergy and ecumenical colleagues twentieth century anglican theologians is the first book to reflect the diversity of the anglican tradition by considering its global theological representatives

gay spirituality represents a hidden strand in western thought that was only publically declared from the gay liberation of the 1970s since coming out expressions of gay spirituality have proliferated in both number and diversity beginning with gay theology within christianity the phenomenon has now reached as far as buddhism and neo paganism but so far critical analysis of the movement has been very limited largely because gay spirituality has been treated as a political and social movement arguing for rights and acceptance within religious circles a special illumination offers an indepth analysis and argues that gay spirituality should be placed at the heart of religion

jonathan s loves david s laments uses early modern musical interpretations of david s lament over saul and jonathan to deepen the historicist foundations of contemporary feminist and gay relational theologies after laying out how gay theologian gary david comstock connects the story of david and jonathan to the theology of lesbian theologian carter heyward the argument interrogates both theological and exegetical problems in making those connections which include contradictory theological stances with regard to modernity and history as well as the indeterminacy of the biblical text early modern musical interpretations of the text allow for a double move of engaging the texts through a sensual medium thus reinforcing queer possibilities for meaning making from the biblical text and staying attuned to the fact that the history of interpretation reinforces the indeterminacy of the text thus keeping queer interpretations aware of the relativizing function of historical difference

couples building bridges shows therapists how to successfully apply basic principles of human interaction and communication to help facilitate intimate connections between people using the approaches in this book you will see how the bridge between couples materializes naturally as a result of the combination of respect truth careful observations awareness and shared information contributors in couples building bridges encourage therapists to bring their own behavior into awareness to see themselves as the major instrument of change in the therapy process and to recognize that work must begin with themselves before starting to work with couples however the book stresses that therapy is not something performed on a couple but rather a process geared toward increasing the range of choice of behavior for clients therapists working with couples or with individuals seeking therapy concerning their intimate relationships will find couples building bridges a valuable reference for promoting healthy open relationships

for religious communities to have integrity and credibility they must flourish as places of love and respect every aspect of church life is defined and protected by essential boundaries boundaries around space time thought speech will emotion and behavior both for clergy and church members lack of awareness and attention to boundary keeping diminishes the integrity of the church and harms its mission

whereas insight and vigilance about best practices lend freedom and energy to the calling of the church to care for others and to reach out to the world in a flourishing christian community a wide array of boundaries must be recognized celebrated and navigated from the boundaries that define and protect us as individual persons to role boundaries and the boundaries that define essential communal functions such as worship this book is no conventional account of boundaries it takes a comprehensive approach to the challenge of understanding and creating healthy boundaries it applies the lessons from the emerging field of behavioral ethics to the rich and rewarding complexity of boundaries in church life helping us to be more loving and responsible in how we think speak and act so that the church can be true to its identity and mission

tracing the impact of the memory wars on science and culture relational remembering offers a vigorous philosophical challenge to the contemporary skepticism about memory that is their legacy campbell s work provides a close conceptual analysis of the strategies used to challenge women s memories particularly those meant to provoke a general social alarm about suggestibility sue campbell argues that we cannot come to an adequate understanding of the nature and value of memory through a distorted view of rememberers the harmful stereotypes of women s passivity and instability that have repopulated discussions of abuse have led many theorists to regard the social dimensions of remembering only negatively as a threat or contaminant to memory integrity such models of memory cannot help us grasp the nature of harms linked to oppression as these models imply that changed group understandings of the past are incompatible with the integrity of personal memory campbell uses the false memory debates to defend a feminist reconceptualization of personal memory as relational social and subject to politics memory is analyzed as a complex of cognitive abilities and social narrative activities where one s success or failure as a rememberer is both affected by one s social location and has profound ramifications for one s cultural status as a moral agent

parentification the assumption of responsibility for the welfare of family members by children and adolescents is increasing as a result of various forces both inside and outside of the family evidence suggests that pathological parentification of children has serious consequences for them and for succeeding generations as do other forms of maltreatment this work is an exploration of the forces at work in families with parentified children and the treatment strategies that hold the promise of interrupting a cycle of destructive behaviour the author begins by guiding the reader from conceptualization to possible causes and manifestations of parentification facilitating a clear understanding of how and why this scenario is common the second part of the book builds on this foundation to introduce methods of assessment treatment and prevention this part of the text includes insights into the professional ethical and personal challenges faced by therapists who themselves have a history of pathological parentification

many feminist theologians have made timely and valuable contributions to rethinking the eschaton by framing it as cyclical and by

embracing endings as they are experienced by present relational fluid and sensuous bodies however any sense of eschatological finality or ultimacy has either been rejected or ignored feminist eschatology seeks to think differently about christian eschatology in light of contributions from feminist theologians noting the numerous and varied critiques they have made of traditional models these critiques are identified as being directed towards three key claims eschatology is understood to be actuated by a domineering god populated by masculinised beings and disassociated from present lives using a form of strategic feminism wherein traits associated with female bodies and some women s experiences of their bodies are used to rethink the end time of the eschaton this book contributes to the meaning and significance of both bodies and eschatology

this work is an exploration of the relationship which psychotherapy has with religion sigmund freud and carl rogers were chosen for this exposition because they were each seduced by the high status given to science freud and rogers both founders of psychotherapies left a legacy which is not that of scientists whom they claimed they were freud and rogers each had a problematic relationship with religion this has had a lasting effect on the work and attitudes of their respective followers in order to explore effectively this relationship the work begins with a critical examination of the historical context in which both freud and rogers worked and how in their determination to be scientists both missed the importance of the religious the work continues with an exploration of the effects of this legacy on the work of contemporary psychotherapists the context in which their followers work relies on a relationship with the founder which goes beyond that of science and in addition each practitioner is influenced by socio economic circumstances which are peculiar to them the resistance from psychotherapists to embrace religion has been complex although as it will be illustrated today there are some who are acknowledging the importance of the spiritual that psychotherapy functions as a religious movement has been excluded by practitioners in their determination to reflect the wishes of their founder which was that their work should be regarded as science psychotherapists have traditionally been considered the custodians of the real and that their clients are the ones suffering from delusions with respect to their attitudes to religion not least the spiritual the positions seem to be reversed

how barbara newman asks did the myth of the separable heart take such a firm hold in the middle ages from lovers exchanging hearts with one another to mystics exchanging hearts with jesus what special traits gave both saints and demoniacs their ability to read minds why were mothers who died in childbirth buried in unconsecrated ground each of these phenomena as diverse as they are offers evidence for a distinctive medieval idea of the person in sharp contrast to that of the modern subject of individual starting from the premise that the medieval self was more permeable than its modern counterpart newman explores the ways in which the self s porous boundaries admitted openness to penetration by divine and demonic spirits and even by other human beings she takes up the idea of coinherence a state familiarly expressed in the amorous and devotional formula i in you and you in me to consider the theory and practice of exchanging the self with others in five relational contexts of increasing intimacy moving from the outside in her chapters deal with charismatic teachers and their students mind reading saints and their penitents lovers trading hearts pregnant mothers who metaphorically and literally carry their children within and women and men in the throes of demonic obsession in a provocative conclusion she sketches some of the far reaching consequences of this type of personhood by drawing on comparative work in cultural history literary criticism anthropology psychology and ethics the permeable self offers medievalists new insight into the appeal and

dangers of the erotics of pedagogy the remarkable influence of courtly romance conventions on hagiography and mysticism and the unexpected ways that pregnancy often devalued in mothers could be positively ascribed to men virgins and god the half forgotten but vital idea of coinherence is of relevance far beyond medieval studies however as newman shows how it reverberates in such puzzling phenomena as telepathy the experience of heart transplant recipients who develop relationships with their deceased donors the phenomenon of psychoanalytic transference even the continuities between ideas of demonic possession and contemporary understandings of obsessive compulsive disorder in the permeable self barbara newman once again confirms her status as one of our most brilliant and thought provoking interpreters of the middle ages
